His research interest lies in Development Economics and Monetary Economics. Currently, he is working on the extent of dependence of East Asian economies on the Western industrialized economies, specifically on the issue of possible decoupling.

Abstract:

This seminar will discuss the economic growth and development of Malaysia against the backdrop of the major economic policy stances that she has adopted since the immediate years after gaining independence from Great Britain in 1957. The discussion will proceed in the context of the various economic growth theories ranging from the neoclassical to the endogenous growth theories.
